Friday, August 7 - Natalie Cole and Peabo Bryson at 8:00pm



Natalie Cole is one of our time's best R&B/Pop vocalists, with twenty –one albums winning nine Grammy® awards and selling over 30 million copies during her acclaimed career. Some of her hits include "This Will Be," Miss You Like Crazy," and "Unforgettable." Peabo Bryson is among the world's most dynamic and gifted R&B/soul vocal talents. Over the course of a career spanning from the mid-1960s, the 2x Grammy® winner has amassed critical acclaim with hits including "If Ever You're in My Arms Again," "Can You Stop The Rain," and "Missing You."

Sunday, August 9 – Counting Crows: Somewhere Under Wonderland Tour with special guest Citizen Cope at 7:30pm Counting Crows have sold more than 20 million albums after exploding onto the music scene with "August and Everything After" in 1993. The band released their seventh studio album "Somewhere Under Wonderland" in 2014. Their hits include "Mr. Jones," "Hanginaround" and "A Long December." Citizen Cope is an American songwriter, producer and performer. His music is a mix of blues, soul, folk, and rock. He has been touring professionally for ten years. Some hits include "Son's Gonna Rise," "Let the Drummer Kick," and "Sideways."

Sunday, August 16 - ZZ Top with Special Guest Blackberry Smoke at 8:00pm



ZZ TOP's music is always instantly recognizable and 100% Texas American in derivation. Some of their hits include "Sharp Dressed Man," "Legs," and "Gimme All Your Lovin'." The original three members are still very much together after more than 40 years of rock, blues, and boogie. **Blackberry Smoke**'s mix of bluesy rock, gospel soul, and country is further elevated by the band's three-part vocal harmonies and arrangements that make judicious use of fiddle and added percussion. Their newest album, *Holding All the Roses*, includes such songs as "Too High" and "Rock and Roll Again."

Friday, August 21 - Chris Tomlin and MercyMe at 8:00pm

Grammy winner **Chris Tomlin** is among the most well-known and influential artists in contemporary Christian music. With 11 albums, selling over 3 million copies, his hits include "Your Grace is Enough," "Our God," and "At the Cross." Contemporary Christian rock group **MercyMe** has released 8 studio albums, garnered 26 No. 1 Christian radio singles, and four mainstream radio hits with "I Can Only Imagine," "Here With Me," "Homesick" and "So Long Self."

Saturday, August 22 - Bruce Hornsby and the Noisemakers and Blues Traveler at 8:00pm



Bruce Hornsby has focused on projects that sparked his creative interest during his two-and-a-half decade recording career, including collaborations with the Grateful Dead, Bela Fleck, and Bonnie Raitt. Hornsby's performance, here with his six-piece band The Noisemakers, will offer a glimpse of a restless spirit who continues to push forward into exciting new musical terrain. Over the course of their illustrious 25+ year career, rockers Blues Traveler's 11 studio albums have sold more than 10 million copies. They received a Grammy Award for the hit "Run-Around." Their other hits include "But Anyway," "100 Years," and "Hook." Their latest album, Blow Up The Moon, features collaborations with Hanson, Dirty Heads, Jewel, and many more.

Friday, August 28 – The Four Tops & The Temptations at 8:00pm

In 1990, with 24 Top 40 pop hits to their credit, the **Four Tops** were inducted into the Rock & Roll Hall Of Fame. Some of their biggest hits include: "I Can't Help Myself (Sugar Pie, Honey Bunch)," "It's The Same Old Song," and "Reach Out I'll Be There." For more than forty years, **The Temptations** have prospered, and over the course of their career have had 83 charted Billboard U.S. singles and 44 Billboard Top 10 Hits including "My Girl," "Ain't Too Proud," "Papa was a rolling stone," and "I Can't Get Next to You."

Reminders

- All sales are final; tickets may not be exchanged if better seats open up at a later date
- Ticket are for the concert only and do not include daytime estate admission or admission to Biltmore House & Gardens.
- Concert tickets may be upgraded to include daytime estate admission (Biltmore House and Gardens) for the day of or day following the concert.
- Concert guests may purchase a discounted Biltmore Annual Pass on the night of the concert by presenting their concert tickets.
- Tickets being held must be picked up at the Reception and Ticketing Sales Center by 7:30 p.m.
- Your concert ticket permits estate entry at 4:30 p.m.
- Dining reservations and picnic options are available; call toll-free 866-336-1255 for more information.
- Seating for general admission is on a first-come, first-served basis beginning at 6:15 p.m. Concerts begin at 8:00 p.m.
- Shuttles are available between the concert area and parking lots.
- Accessible seating for scooters and wheelchairs is available on the Library Terrace. Scooters and wheelchairs are not permitted in the general seating area due to safety concerns.
- Children 9 and under are not permitted in the concert venue except for the August 21 Chris Tomlin and MercyMe concert when children age three and older may attend and must have a ticket. Due to sound levels, it is not recommended that children under 2 attend the August 21 Chris Tomlin and MercyMe concert.

Concert Guidelines


- All concerts begin at 8:00 p.m. WITH THE EXCEPTION OF Counting Crows with Citizen Cope which starts at 7:30pm August 9.
- Once on the estate, please allow a minimum of 45 minutes to get to the concert area.
- Please keep concert tickets with you at all times. Guests must sit in the seats for which they have tickets. Only guests with reserved tickets will be allowed in the reserved seating section.
- Smoking and smokeless tobacco products (including e-cigarettes) are not permitted in the concert venue.
- Firearms (open or concealed carry) are not permitted on Biltmore Company property.
- Please be aware that bags are subject to being searched each time you enter the concert area.
- No recording, filming, photography, or taping of concerts is allowed.
- No outside food, beverages, or coolers are allowed in the concert seating area, Biltmore House front lawn area, Stable
 Courtyard, or Antler Hill Village. No outside alcohol is ever permitted on Biltmore property; failure to observe this policy could
 result in removal from the concert and estate.
- Tailgating, including the use of tents, grills, multiple camping chairs, tables, and large coolers is not permitted in Biltmore parking lots or on the grounds.
- Picnics with outside food and beverage are permitted in other locations on the grounds, and we invite you to Guest Services for recommended picnic spots.
- · Concerts are held rain or shine; no umbrellas are allowed in the concert seating area.
- In order to ensure the safety and enjoyment of all concert goers, guests shall comply with instructions given by Biltmore personnel.
- Guests who do not comply with the concert guidelines may be asked to leave the property and will not receive a refund.
- Guests who become intoxicated or engage in disruptive conduct may be removed without refund.
- Check biltmore.com for last minute changes or updates.
- Resale of concert tickets is prohibited.

Refund Policy

Concert tickets are non-refundable and good only for the concert for which they are sold. If the concert occurs but the ticket is not used, no refunds are issued. If the performer or Biltmore cancels the concert, tickets are void and refunds will be automatically distributed within 6–8 weeks of the event. Up-to-date information will be posted at biltmore.com. In the event a concert has to be canceled, we will also attempt to notify ticket holders by the cell phone number provided when tickets were purchased.
